Stanford/Pre-Collegiate Studies

Stanford High School Summer College is where exceptional high school students take Stanford undergraduate course and earn college credit! When you become a Stanford student for the summer, you will have access to what makes Stanford a world-renowned research and teaching university.

High School Summer College

Students ages 16-19 choose from more than 145 college courses in 30 academic departments, earning Stanford undergraduate course credit and an official Stanford University transcript. Students in the residential, commuting, and online Summer College programs create their own course schedules and experience what life is like as undergraduate students at Stanford.

Summer Institutes

At the Summer Institutes, high school students engage in intensive, single-subject courses with instructors and peers who share their talents, passions, and interests. Coursework is tightly integrated with the social experience in academically themed residences. Courses in areas ranging from business to biotechnology and cryptography to creative writing are customized to give students deep exposure and hands-on experience. There are over 50 courses from which to choose.

Stanford University Mathematics Camp (SUMaC)

At SUMaC, an elite group of talented rising high school juniors and seniors from around the world come to Stanford for intensive study in advanced mathematics through lectures, guided research, and group problem solving. In a social environment centered on mathematics, students explore current lines of mathematical research and applications across scientific disciplines.

University-Level Online Math and Physics Courses

For students who have surpassed their high school's math and physics curriculum, University-Level Online Math & Physics courses are offered throughout the year and are largely self-paced, giving students the opportunity to take a broad array of math and physics courses. Expert instructors are available for optional office hours to meet with students online and offer assistance as they progress through the course material. All Courses carry Stanford University Continuing Studies credit.

Anytown Leadership Camp

Leadership Camp is a youth leadership program that celebrates diversity and reduces bias, bigotry, and prejudice by bringing young people of all races, cultures, religions, and backgrounds together for a challenging week of learning, sharing and change. Anytown helps bring awareness to these issues, and once this awareness has been achieved, participants are then enabled and empowered to become leaders within their school communities. Youth participants that graduates from the Anytown Leadership Program will receive a certificate for 50 hours of leadership training and service.

Anytown Leadership Camp is for youth ages 14 to 19.
